### u sa y Policy

This document sets out the Colle e's policy on the calculation of eli ibility to, and payment of bursaries. The schemes are desi ned to support as many students as possible in a fair and e ual manner.

#### 1. eneral

- The Colle e currently distributes four bursary funds on behalf of central overnment, namely:
  - 6- Vulnerable Bursary Scheme
  - 6- Discretionary Bursary Scheme
  - + Discretionary Bursary Scheme
  - Advanced Learnin Loans Bursary.
- These are separate funds, and it is not possible to transfer from fund to fund. As such, the four schemes may experience different terms and different rates of payment throu hout the year.
- There is also an additional fund that can help with childcare for students a ed up to 20. This is administered by central overnment directly and is called Care 2 Learn, and can be applied for throu h Student Support.
- There are also a number of funds operated by charitable trusts that only cater for certain cohorts of students. Advice on these is available from Student Support.
- Bursary applications must be made before the October half-term holiday. At this time, they will be paused temporarily and reviewed to ensure that they are helpin the majority of students. If the fund(s) allow, then one or more of the schemes may ree y u unrhfbfsni+eahsss, fnananu lnibo

- The Colle e is responsible for settin a threshold for 6- Discretionary, + Discretionary Bursary and the Advanced Learnin Loans Bursary, over which they will not ualify for support. This varies accordin to the fund applied for, and is set out below.
- The Colle e will retain a small proportion of each fund for use as a hardship fund. This will be administered by Student Support and will only be used when it is considered by a member of staff that a period of enuine hardship is occurrin, and a modest one-off payment or e uipment purchase will create a positive outcome for a student. This cannot be used for re-ular or on-oin expenses, as this will inhibit its reach within the student population.
- . 0 For the purposes of this policy, household earnin s includes:
  - Earnin s from employment
  - Job seekers allowance
  - Employment & support allowance
  - Universal credit
  - Pension (both old a e and private)
  - Workin tax credits
  - Child tax credits
  - Other re ular income (such as child maintenance income)

#### But specifically excludes:

- Housin benefit
- Child benefit
- Disability livin allowance or personal independence payments
- Students a ed under 24 must provide these details for all persons livin at the address, includin silisbud ( e th ioy.

## 4. 1 + iscretionary Bursary Sche e

- 4. This scheme pays out to all eli ible students with household earnin s (as defined in para raphs . 0-. 3) of less than £25,000.
- These payments may be paid directly to a supplier on the student's behalf, or the student may be re uired to submit receipts as proof of purchase.
- Students a ed 20 and over with children, can also apply for assistance with childcare (see para . 6). Any assistance with childcare is subject to a cap of

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
